• Partner with business areas to identify the best equipment, process, workflow, work environment and facility decisions which impact associate and customer safety.

• Create and utilize performance metrics to measure the effectiveness of operating systems and environmental health and safety programs.

• Maintain effective communication within the organization to align with organizational priorities and desired results.

• Ensure all associates are adequately prepared and trained to safely perform their jobs and ensure related operating systems are in place.
